MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIRMAN/FOUNDER - CHRIS MEEK

Dear Patriots,

"As we express our gratitude we must never forget that the highest appreciation is not to utter words but to live by them." So said President John F. Kennedy in 1963. Those are words that have echoed throughout American history, where a storied

tradition resides to give back to our nation's armed forces - not just in words but through action. SoldierStrong continues to build a lasting legacy based on the same foundation by providing veterans with revolutionary medical technologies that would have only existed in the imaginations of our forefathers.

Though the manners in which Americans give back have changed considerably over the centuries, the guiding impulse behind SoldierStrong's work remains unchanged: to anticipate and meet the needs of our nation's veterans.

Currently, the United States is tragically losing 17 veterans a day to suicide. Addressing the crisis of veteran suicide requires more than recognizing, acknowledging, and even investing in prevention efforts. Solutions come through innovative approaches. Those innovative approaches are at the heart of what we do and can be seen in our initiatives such as Battle Buddy, the virtual human-led mobile mental health and wellness application that SoldierStrong recently received a \$1 million award for from the United States Department of Veterans Affairs, and the BraveMind virtual reality system, which SoldierStrong has deployed to six VA hospitals so far this year, bringing our total number of BraveMind donations to 30.

Despite the decreasing trend, veteran suicide still requires more innovations. Even one suicide per day is too many. SoldierStrong thanks all Americans for supporting our mission, enabling us to fulfill the obligation of caring for service men and women. We are pleased to present your support in action throughout these pages.

SOLDIERSTRONG RECEIVES \$1 MILLION MISSION DAYBREAK AWARD

SoldierStrong, in partnership with the University of Southern California's Institute For Creative Technologies (USC-ICT), were recognized as one of ten winners of the United States Department of Veterans Affairs' Mission Daybreak initiative. Mission Daybreak is a \$20 million grand challenge to reduce veteran suicide as part of VA's 10 year strategy to end veteran suicide through a comprehensive, public health approach. **As a second place winner, SoldierStrong and USC-ICT received a \$1 million award.**

Our partnership was awarded for our efforts to advance the use of technology to prevent suicide through Battle Buddy, a virtual human-led mobile mental health and wellness application. This interactive, embodied conversational agent leverages content related to the VA's Suicide Safety Planning program embedded within brief daily check-ins with veterans. The Virtual Human will also allow veterans to opt-in to connect their wearable sensors to the app, leveraging sleep, exercise, vocal analytics and other sensed signals to their overall well-being.

Upon launching the multiphase challenge in May 2022, VA received more than 1,300 concept submissions in Phase 1 from veterans, veteran service organizations, communitybased organizations, health tech companies, startups and universities. Last year, SoldierStrong and USC-ICT were selected as one of 30 finalists before ultimately being awarded second place winners in February 2023 by a multidisciplinary judging panel, which represented a diversity of perspectives, from veterans and clinicians to social workers and technical experts.

SoldierStrong is incredibly honored to be recognized by the United States Department of Veterans Affairs' Mission Daybreak initiative for our partnership in innovation with USC-ICT in the veteran's mental health space. We are eager to share more information about Battle Buddy with our supporters in the near future.



Addressing the crisis of veterans taking their own lives requires more than recognizing, acknowledging, and even investing in prevention efforts. Solutions will come through innovative approaches that are only possible through relationships that share valuable information and capitalize on each partner's strengths. Effectively leveraging real-time data via easy-to-implement technology will significantly enhance individual wellbeing and aid efforts to reduce the overall number of suicides. Working with such an exceptional partner as the University of Southern California Institute of Creative Technologies to create a life-changing – and lifesaving – breakthrough of this scope is one of the very reasons SoldierStrong was founded.

Mike's passion has been developing new technology solutions that improve peoples' lives. His most rewarding projects were leading a portfolio of Virtual Reality projects including: building simulators for medical training and surgery, driver training, disaster preparedness, clinical trials for pain management, and working with Dr. Albert "Skip" Rizzo on Project Bravemind. Prior to Intel, Mike was a U.S. Naval Officer, deploying to the Persian Gulf and Central America on USS Crommelin, a guided missile frigate. SOLDIERSTRONG DONATES SIX BRAVEMIND SYSTEMS

Six medical facilities are the country's latest under the United States Department of Veterans Affairs' umbrella to partner with SoldierStrong to provide the revolutionary virtual reality therapy system known as BraveMind to aid in treating veterans experiencing post-traumatic stress.

The virtual reality technology behind BraveMind was developed by Dr. Albert "Skip" Rizzo and his team at the University of Southern California's Institute for Creative Technologies. The technology creates 14 "worlds" of combat scenarios, from a desert roadway to a crowded Iraqi marketplace or a slum in an Afghan city. Therapists select a world based on a veteran's traumatic experience and customize it in the virtual reality headset, thus placing veterans back within the midst of that memory at a pace they can handle. The six donations so far in 2023 bring SoldierStrong's total donations of BraveMind to 30.

SoldierStrong donated an Ekso Indego robotic exoskeleton, also known as a "SoldierSuit," to the Charlie Norwood Department of Veterans Affairs Medical Center in Augusta, GA in April to help paralyzed and injured veterans stand and walk again. This donation re-establishes SoldierStrong's partnership with Ekso Bionics and is the the 30th robotic exoskeleton that SoldierStrong has donated to a Veteran Affairs medical center in the last ten years of operations.

We are honored to be joining forces with Ekso Bionics to provide revolutionary technologies and innovative advancements to improve the lives of veterans and their families at no cost. The Ekso Indego Therapy will bring much needed rehabilitation support to our valued veterans within their homes enabling them to achieve mobility freedom that they deserve.
